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## Summary

### **Student sleep**

The student surveys began with questions about sleep and scheduling. Students in grades 5-12 reported below-normal levels of sleep, reporting less sleep with each progressing grade. The average sleep reported for students in Grades 5-6 was 8.3h. The average sleep reported for high school students was 6.6h. By grade 12, students reported an average of 6.2h.


### **Options for students**

Two different surveys were administered to students in grades 5-12 during school hours. Grades 5-6 were presented with four options that were described in terms of school start and end times that would correspond with the options presented to Masconomet students, with descriptions of the impacts on their elementary schedules. Grades 7-12 were presented with four options whose times and schedules aligned with the parent and staff survey, but without the logistical and cost variations that were presented to parents and staff.




#### Masconomet Support/Acceptability of the options

Option A (4 in survey): no change Masconomet students prefer Option A: No change (63%). 52% of Masconomet students were worried about the effects of this option on their sleep, and 37% were worried about the effects on their health. 
The Elementary survey had a total of 582 responses, and the Masconomet survey had a total of 1,472 responses for a grand total of 2,054 responses, or 84% of the student community.

Since some questions were skipped, the percentages for each question show the *% of those who answered the question*, not the *%* of total respondents.

Throughout this report, when question numbers are shown, they are formatted as: Q5M (meaning question 5 from the Masconomet survey) or Q5E (meaning question 5 from the elementary survey). If it is marked "Q5" then it was the same question number on both surveys.


## Q1: On an average school night, how many hours of sleep do you get?

The average amount of sleep on a school night is shown in the chart below, by grade. For reference, the National Sleep Foundation recommended sleep ranges are shown in yellow. The average sleep for students in Grades 5-6 is 8.3h per night. The average sleep for students in Grades 7-8 is 7.3h. The average sleep for students in Grades 9-12 is 6.6h per night.




Average sleep per night on a school night, by grade

Looking at the individual responses, we can see what proportions of our students get at least 9 hours for grades 5-6 and 8 hours for grades 7-12:



So of students, by grade, getting the recommended amount of sleep


We can compare the responses for students in Grades 9-12 to the national Youth Risk Behavior Survey for high school students, which asks the same question. Masconomet students are getting less than the national average: the bell-curve trendline for Masconomet (blue) is shifted to the left of the bell-curve trendline for the YRBS Grade 9-12 national data (green).




## Q2: How do you feel about the amount of sleep you get?

In addition, we asked students to reflect on how they feel about the sleep they are getting.

43% of students in grade 5 and 41% of students in grades 6 report that they are getting the right amount of sleep. 11% of Grade 5 students and 14% of grade 6 students say that they want a lot more sleep.



35% of students in Grades 7-8 say that they are getting enough sleep, while only 19% of students in Grades 9-12 agree. In Grades 7-12, 48% report that they could use more sleep. In Grades 9-12, 31% say that they want a lot more sleep.



## Q3: What time do you feel awake and ready to learn at school?

Students were asked to choose between a set of times: before 7:35am, 7:35am, 7:45am, 8:00am, 8:15a, 8:30am, 8:45am, 9:00am, and after 9:00am. Responses were collected and then the average time was calculated.


## Q4E and Q5M: Athletics

We asked several questions about athletics, summarized below.

## Q5M: In this school year, have you or will you participate in athletics (Masconomet and non-Masconomet) in the following seasons (check all that apply)?

This question was *only asked for grades 9-12*:

By looking at the responses, student by student, we were able to see how many sports students participated in, over the course of the school year:



27.5% of students do not participate in a sport at all, and 62.2% of students play 1, 2, or 3 sports during the entire school year. 5.4% of students play 4 sports during the year, and 2.6% play 5 or more sports during the year.


A closer look reveals that 97 out of 902 (10.8%) students play more than one sport at a time, although not necessarily school-sponsored, in any season during the school year.

The average is 1.8 sports/student for all students (including those who play no sports), or 2.5 sports/student for those students who do play sports.












## Q16M: What do you think of Option A (no change)?

The options that were presented to students were slightly different than the options presented to parents and staff, primarily because variations in how the options are paid for are not of interest to the students.




#### Q12M: I am worried about the effect that Option A (8:20am-3:20pm) will have on...


### Q10E: What do you think of Option A (no change)?

## Q7M: What do you think of Option B/C: 7:50am-2:25pm? (Masco)



#### Q8M: I am worried about the effect that Option B/C will have on...


This question was asked only of Masconomet students. Responses for *Agree Somewhat* and *Agree* are combined and shown as positive numbers. Responses for *Disagree Somewhat* and *Disagree* are combined and shown as negative numbers. Students were not offered a neutral response.

With an end time of 2:25pm (10m later than the current end time), 55% of Masconomet students were worried about the effects on their activities outside of school.




#### Q7E: What do you think of Option #B/C: Start and end elementary school 15m later?

This question was asked of students in Grades 5-6, and refers to the change in start time for the *elementary schools*, not Masconomet. This option is equivalent to Option B (add 3 buses) and Option C (neighborhood stops) on the Parent/Staff survey. The elementary students were told that this option would start and end elementary schools 15m later.




## Q23M: Are you willing to walk a little further to your bus stop in the morning for a later start (assuming it's safe to do so)?

This question was only asked of Masconomet students (elementary students were not expected to walk to neighborhood stops under Option C).




## Q15M: What do you think of Option D (8:40am-3:20pm)?

This option was presented to Masconomet students as Option 3. This option is equivalent to Option D (swap) on the Parent/Staff survey. The options that were presented to students were slightly different than the options presented to parents and staff, primarily because variations in how the options are paid for are not of interest to the students.




### Q12M: I am worried about the effect that Option 3/D (8:40am-3:20pm) will have on...


#### Q9E: What do you think of Option #3/D: Start and end school earlier (8:00am - 2:30pm)?


## Q13M: What do you think about Option E/F: 8:20am-3:00pm?


#### Q14M: I am worried about the effect that Option E/F (8:20am-3:00pm) will have on...


## Q8E: What do you think of Option #2: Same school times, grades K - 12 ride the bus together? (Elem)

This question was asked of students in Grades 5-6, and refers to the change in start time for the *elementary school*, not Masconomet. This option is equivalent to Option E (K-12 busing) on the Parent/Staff survey.



#### Q24M/Q15E: I think it is acceptable to have students in grades K - 12 ride the bus together.


Option 2 for Masconomet students is equivalent to Option E (K-12 busing) and Option F (double busing) on the Parent/Staff survey. In Q24, we asked Masconomet students if they would be willing to walk a little further for a later start (Option C). We asked Elementary students the same question in Q15 of their survey. Their responses are shown here.


#### **Masconomet support for options**




## Q19M and Q20M: Rank options (Masconomet)

We asked Masconomet respondents to rank the options in order, 1-4, with #1 being the highest ranking and #4 being the lowest. In reading these results, an option that was ranked #1 by everyone would receive an average ranking of "1" and the option that was rating #6 by everyone would receive an average ranking of "4". Responses are shown in order, from highest to lowest rank. Note that the times shown are for *Masconomet*.






## Q11E and Q12E: Rank options (Elementary)

We asked elementary respondents to rank the options in order, 1-4, with #1 being the highest ranking and #4 being the lowest. In reading these results, an option that was ranked #1 by everyone would receive an average ranking of "1" and the option that was rating #6 by everyone would receive an average ranking of "4". Responses are shown in order, from highest to lowest rank. Note that the times shown are for *elementary schools*.

Q12E: If you didn't have to worry about after school activities (athletics, and lessons, for example), how would you rank the options?




### Which options are acceptable and unacceptable?


We asked respondents to select the options they considered acceptable and to select the options they considered unacceptable. The results show the % of respondents who considered an option acceptable (positive percentages) or unacceptable (negative percentages). For example, a 100% would mean that everyone agrees that the option is acceptable and a -100% would mean that everyone agrees the option is unacceptable.

#### Q21M and Q22M

These are the acceptable/unacceptable ratings for the Masconomet students. Note that the times shown are for Masconomet.



Acceptability corresponds with end time. The later school ends, the less acceptable the option is. Notice that acceptability corresponds with end time. The following shows proposed ends times for school and Extra Help, with acceptability for those times marked. The later these times are, the lower the acceptability.



### Q13E and Q14E

These are the acceptable/unacceptable ratings for the elementary students in Grades 5-6.

For elementary students, an 8:00 start is the most acceptable, followed by the current schedule. More students consider a 15 minute later start unacceptable than acceptable.
