<u>Call to Order</u>: H. Rivers called the meeting to order at 4:34pm in the Middle School principal's conference room at Masconomet.

Proposed warrant article items for spring, 2018:

Past warrant articles: S. Givens presented a report on the spring, 2017 warrant article spending. Some work has been completed (solar powered traffic lights, security system update – except for a server upgrade). Some items will be done during the summer of 2018 (VoIP phone system replacement, interior signage installation). The funding for testing/monitoring the electrical feed lines will be used to track down the electrical "gremlins" plaguing the building so that we can get an accurate estimate for repairs. The fire suppression system upgrade will need to wait until the bond is issued and major construction begins, as it will include completely new wiring.

- New AEDs (defibrillators) considered essential for safety.
- Electrical problems continue to plague the building. The line item included both diagnosis and an estimate for repair. We discussed using funds from previous warrant article and funds from the Stabilization fund to diagnose the problems. Once a diagnosis is found, a more concrete estimate for repairs should be considered for a warrant article. Solving the electrical problems is essential for protecting equipment from surges and power issues.
- The roof repairs are for sections of the roof that are leaking and areas that are so fragile that they cannot be walked on. As the School Building Authority (SBA) will not accept a proposal to fund roof repairs for another 3 years, we must maintain the roof and all that it protects until we are able to apply for those funds.
- Woodshop upgrade and security cameras were considered essential for safety.
- The air conditioning units are Liebert systems, high end systems specially designed to protect fragile IT equipment. Our current equipment is not in air conditioned spaces, and extreme heat places the district's investment at risk. The task force asked for more details on the bid for this project.
- The task force discussed breaking the replacement of furniture into smaller chunks and including some of the replacement in the budget. S. Givens will provide a proposed breakdown at our next meeting.
- The auditorium's audio system is nearly unusable.
- S. Givens will provide more information on the Habeeb items, including the gas piping and abandoned sprinkler system in the elevator shafts.
- We discussed moving toward the new student health center in stages, starting with staffing changes and targeted purchases for this year and laying the groundwork for the new construction in the future.
- We also discussed several items from the "yellow" section to be included: rekeying door locks (for safety), and athletic maintenance: mobile bleachers, gym bleachers, football bleachers, and tennis court repairs.

The task force discussed which items could be paid for from the Masconomet stabilization fund. H. Rivers pointed out that maintaining a good balance in that fund will be essential to obtaining a good bond rating for the district.

The task force discussed which items are essential, and the potential size of the warrant article. We also discussed the potential challenges of having two selectmen on the task force (K. Prentakis, selectmen in Middleton and J. Spencer, selectmen in Topsfield) and the importance of representing both the voters' and the students' needs in these discussions.

S. Givens will revise the list of warrant article items for discussion at the next meeting.

For Next Meeting: the task force will review the revised list of proposed warrant articles and schedule future meetings.
