Kids who are interesting in racing are encouraged to participate in the New England High School Cycling Association (NEHSCA) race series or to just try a race and see if they like it. Practice rides on local trails typically run April-June and September-October on Wednesday and Friday afternoons and occasionally on weekends (attendance is not mandatory – ride when you can!). The group also likes to volunteer to help with local trail maintenance and clean-up efforts. The team is coached primarily by parents who have backgrounds in road and mountain bike racing and share the ultimate team goal of having fun on bikes while developing new skills and friendships! 



Audition Workshop

<u>Students are required to attend ONE of the two workshops listed above</u>. At the workshop, students will learn about the show and the rehearsal process, as well as learn the music and scenes required for the audition.

Auditions

Monday, January 14, 3-5pm Tuesday, January 15, 3-5pm Thursday, January 17, 3-5pm

Students must <u>sign-up</u> for <u>ONE</u> of the above <u>dates</u> on the sign-up sheet outside my office, C1501 (next to the middle school chorus room). Auditions will consist of singing a selection from the show, performing a scene or monologue, and a short dance audition. Students will be at the audition for the entire time, ending at 5pm.

Students must bring the following to their audition:

- 1. Clothes they can move in.
- 2. Completed and signed audition form.*
- 3. Completed and signed medical form.
- 4. Completed and signed activity registration (if not already done).
- 5. \$100 activity fee (if not already paid).
- *Audition form should **list ALL known conflicts** for the entirety of the production (January 22-May 4).
- *Audition form should be **signed by both student and parent**.

ABOUT HONK, JR.

Ugly looks quite a bit different from his darling duckling brothers and sisters. The other animals on the farm are quick to notice and point this out, despite his mother's protective flapping. Feeling rather foul about himself, the little fowl finds himself on an adventure of self-discovery, all the while unknowingly outwitting a very hungry Cat. Along the way, Ugly meets a whole flock of unique characters and finds out being different is not a bad thing to be.

Honk! Jr. is a heartwarming celebration of being different that is sure to delight audiences of all ages with its sparkling wit, unique charm and memorable score. Witty and hilarious, but also deeply moving, *Honk! Jr.* will treat you to equal amounts of laughter and tears.

CHARACTER DESCRIPTIONS

LEADING ROLES

Drake

Ida's husband. Drake is a sarcastic character. He is the stereotypical sitcom father - often shirking his parental duties. Drake finds Ugly quite repulsive and isn't afraid to say it to anyone, including his wife. He should have good comic timing and a strong singing voice. Drake opens the show singing "A Poultry Tale."

Gender: Male

Vocal range top: Baritone/Tenor/Medium Low

Ida

Ugly's mom. Ida is extremely protective of her son and committed to his safety. She is sweet but fei sty, and she knows how to handle her husband, Drake. After Ugly is lured away from the barnyard by the Cat, Ida is determined to find him. Ida and Ugly's relationship is a key ingredient of the show. She is the one who teaches him that it is OK to be different. Ida sings several solos.

Gender: Female

Vocal range top: Mezzo-Soprano/Middle Low

Maureen

A moorhen and Ida's best friend. (Originally found on the moors, a moorhen is a hen that lives near the water.) Maureen genuinely loves Ida, but she can't resist a bit of good gossip. To the little ducklings, she is the typical annoying and overly affectionate "aunt." Maureen sings "The Joy of Motherhood" with Ida.

Gender: Female

Vocal range: Mezzo-Soprano/Middle Low

Ugly

The ugly ducking and the main character of *Honk! Jr*. Innocent, easily confused and very impressionable, Ugly doesn't understand why it's wrong to be different. However, their insecurities melt away as they gradually change from a gullible duckling to a wise swan, filled with self-esteem. They are the heart and soul of the show. Gender: Any

Vocal range: Tenor/Mezzo-Soprano/Medium High

The Cat

The sly, cunning villain of the show. All of the other animals are deathly afraid of them. They are manipulative, cunning, witty and above all, HUNGRY. The Cat pretends to be Ugly's friend so they can eat him. The actor playing this role should bring a sense of fun to the character and have a good sense of comic timing. They sing a few songs, but the character allows for many of the lyrics to be "talk-sung." Improv skills are a plus.

Gender: Any

Vocal range top: Baritone/Alto/Middle Low

Greylag

A somewhat pompous goose and washed-up British military type, Greylag tends to over glorify his mundane activities (i.e. migrating South) to the level of military operation status. Only his wife, Dot, truly knows how to handle him. He sings a solo in "Wild Goose Chase."

Gender: Male

Vocal range: Baritone/Middle Low

Dot

A motherly type, she is genuinely concerned with helping Ugly find his mother. Dot doesn't think that Greylag, her husband, is an entirely capable leader, but she kindly humors his "over the top" actions. She sings solo as well as with Greylag in "Wild Goose Chase."

Gender: Female

Vocal Range: Mezzo-Soprano/Middle

The Bullfrog

A laidback, self-confident frog with whom Ugly comes into contact in the second half of the show. The frog cheers Ugly up with their song, "Warts and All." Optimistic and funny, they're a stand-up comedian type of character, well-suited to someone with good improvisational sills and comic timing.

Gender: Any

Vocal range: Baritone/Mezzo/Middle

SECONDARY ROLES

Beaky, Fluff, Billy, Downy

Beaky, Fluff, Billy, Downy are Ugly's siblings. They are among the "popular" ones in the duck yard who enjoy making Ugly feel left out. They sing as a group.

Gender: Any

The Turkey

The headmaster of the ducklings' school. The Turkey is a bit snobbish and joins in the fun of teasing Ugly. There is of course one word that send shivers down their spine - THANKSGIVING! The Turkey sings with a small group in "Look at Him".

Gender: Any

Grace

The most distinguished duck on the lake. Very aristocratic, she is considered the queen of the duck yard. All of the other animals look up to Grace and respect her. She, of course, is quite aware of this and is therefore a little bit haughty. Grace sings with a small group in "Look at Him".

Gender: Female

Henrietta

A hen and another of Maureen's friends. Henrietta and Maureen gossip about the goings on in the duck yard. She takes great pleasure in making fun of Ugly. Henrietta sings with a small group in "Look at Him".

Gender: Female

Jay Bird

An investigative reporter. A very "in your face" bird, all they care about is getting a good story. They are the typical TV news personality who one would find on a reality TV show like "America's Most Wanted." They report a story about Ugly's disappearance.

Gender: Any

Barnacles, Snowy & Pinkfoot

The geese in Greylag's "squad." They join in singing "Wild Goose Chase."

Gender: Any

Penny

The young, beautiful swan that Ugly saves from a tangled fishing net. They are able to see beyond Ugly's looks and loves them for who they are. They do not sing a solo.

Gender: Any

Mother Swan

Penny's mother. She helps to console Ida when she thinks her son has died, and offers to take Ugly with them when they migrate. She does not sing a solo.

Gender: Female

Father Swan

Penny's father. He helps to console Ida when she thinks her son has died, and offers to take Ugly with them when they migrate. He does not sing a solo.

Gender: Male

Bewick

Penny's sibling. They help to console Ida when she thinks her son has died, and they offer to take Ugly with them when they migrate. They do not sing a solo.

Gender: Any

Boy/Girl

Two of three humans in the show. They are never seen by the audience, only their voices are heard. These voices may be pre-recorded or said live from backstage during the show.

Gender: Any

The Farmer

One of three humans in the show. They are never seen by the audience, only their voices are heard. These voices may be pre-recorded or said live from backstage during the show. Gender: Any

Ensemble

Throughout the action of the play, ensemble members take on roles as barn yard animals, geese, children at play, froglets, and are part of the Blizzard scene.

Schedule

January 22 - April 26: Rehearsals

The first rehearsal will be held Tuesday, January 22, from 3-5pm. Rehearsals will generally be held Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays from 3-5pm, with the exception of January 28, February vacation, and April vacation. Detailed weekly schedules will be emailed no later than the Friday prior to the address provided on the audition form, handed out to cast members at rehearsal, and posted on the Drama Club's website:

https://sites.google.com/a/masconomet.org/msdrama/. Please note that not all students will be called to all rehearsals, depending on the roles in which they are cast.

April 28 – May 4: Tech Week & Performances

During tech week, rehearsals are MANDATORY for all cast members, and will be held Monday through Thursday from 3:00-6:00pm. Performances will be Friday, May 3rd at 7:00pm and Saturday, May 4th at 7:00pm (students will be called at 5:30pm for 7:00pm showtime).

Activity Registration

Students are required to fill out the 2018-19 activity registration form (attached to this packet) and submit their fee of \$100 at their audition. Refund policy is as follows:

<u>All Roles</u> – If the student selects this option on their audition form and they decline their role, a refund will not be available.

<u>Lead Role Only</u> – If the student selects this option, they will not be cast unless given a lead role. If they are not cast, a refund will be given.

<u>Secondary Role Only</u> – If the student selects this option and declines the role they are given, a refund will not be available.

Attendance Policy

Like any team sport or group activity, participation and attendance are essential for a successful production. Any conflicts not listed on the audition form that a student performer may have must be brought to the director's attention within 24 hours of the rehearsal they will miss, be tardy to, or have to leave early from. If a student is late or absent from a rehearsal without being excused 3 times, they risk having their role changed. If a student is late or absent (unexcused) more than 3 times, they will be removed from the production. Students are also expected to arrive to rehearsal prepared (just as they would a class) with any materials (script, pencil, water, etc.) necessary for that day. Arriving unprepared/unable to participate will count as an absence.

***Please note that any additional conflicts that arise during the production must be given to the director, Ms. Rachael Furgiuele (rfurgiuele@masconomet.org) at least 24 hours prior to the conflict, or it will be counted as an unexcused absence.

Respect Policy

School rules still apply. The expectation for drama club members is that they will treat each other, drama club property, and themselves with respect. If a student is disrespectful or does not follow the school rules as outlined in the Masconomet Middle School Calendar Handbook 2018-2019, they may have their role changed or be removed from the production depending on the severity of the transgression.
