4. Review old quizzes/tests to identify areas you struggled with.

5. Identify distractions and eliminate them. Put your phone on silent and put it in another room. Find a quiet space to study. Work in breaks with rewards. (After 30 minutes, get up and get a snack, check your phone, etc.)
