#### **Summary**

This survey asked parents, staff, and community members to evaluate six possible options for a start time change for the Masconomet Regional School District. Some of the options would result in timing changes for the Tri Town Union elementary schools in Boxford, Middleton, and Topsfield. These options were presented with potential implementation impacts. This report summarizes the results from the STAFF respondents to the survey.

**Option A** (No change): On the whole, staff preferred no change, although about one third of staff supported the changes as presented.

**Option B** and **Option C** both proposed a modest (approx. 15 minute) change in the Masconomet schedule and a modest change (10 minute) in the elementary schedules:

Option B (Tighten schedules and add 3 buses) garnered modest support.

**Option C** (Neighborhood stops and tighten schedules): garnered less support.

**Option D**, **Option E** and **Option F** all would move Masconomet to a later start and finish. On average, the staff share the same concerns over what will happen to Masconomet athletics, extraand co-curricular activities, Extra Help, child care, commutes, schedules, etc. However, even with these concerns, some options were more favorably regarded than others:

**Option D** (Elementary first, Masconomet second) received much stronger support than expected from the elementary staff. About an equal number of elementary staff both like and dislike this option. Very few Masconomet staff supported this option, with most concerns around the schedule effects at Masconomet.

Option E (K-12 busing) was strongly disliked, particularly by the elementary staff.

**Option F** (double busing) received modest support, with most concerns around the schedule effects at Masconomet.

One way to see these forces is through the analysis of the support/oppose question for each option (Q2, Q4, Q6, Q8, Q10, and Q12):



Another way to see these forces is through the analysis of the acceptable/unacceptable questions (Q15/Q16):



In summary, this is how the options were received by respondents:

- Option A: No change *preferred by a wide margin*
- Option B: Tighten schedules and add 3 buses *modest support*
- Option C: Neighborhood stops and tighten schedules less support
- Option D: Elementary first, Masconomet second *modest support*
- Option E: Start all schools near 8:30a with K-12 busing *strongly disliked*
- Option F: Start all schools near 8:30a with double busing modest support

#### **Survey Respondents**

Survey was administered to the parent and staff community from March 10, 2017 to March 20, 2017 with multiple reminders sent via email.

#### **Total Respondents**

Survey had 1,263 respondents. 861 of those were complete responses (answering all available questions). Since some questions were skipped, the percentages for each question show the % of those who answered the question, not the % of total respondents.

#### Q18 Choose the best description of yourself

- 671 were parents (68.26%) Response rate approximately 10-15%
- 282 were staff (28.69%) Response rate approximately 50%
- 26 were community members (2.64%)
- 284 declined to specify and are not included in the percentage tally for this question

#### **Staff Respondents**

#### Q34: Where do you work, primarily?

This question was only asked of Staff, as indicated in Q18.

282 Respondents were staff. 6 declined to provide more detail about where they worked. Of the remaining 276, the staff breakdown is as follows:

- 102 (36.95%) work at Masconomet
  - 27 (9.78%) at the Middle School
  - 67 (24.28%) at the High School
  - 8 (2.90%) at both the Middle and High School
- 174 (63.04%) work at the Elementary schools
  - 58 (21.01%) work at Boxford Elementary
  - 65 (23.55%) at Middleton Elementary
  - 51 (18.48%) at Topsfield Elementary

## Q1-Q12: Support for Each Option

This chart shows only respondents who identified as Staff, with a breakdown between Masconomet Staff and Elementary Staff. Responses for *Support* and *Strongly Support* are combined and shown as positive numbers. Responses for *Oppose* and *Strongly Oppose* are combined and shown as negative numbers. *Neutral* responses are excluded. The first chart shows Masconomet staff, the second chart Elementary staff, and the third chart shows them combined.

## Q13 and Q14: Rank options

We asked respondents to rank the options in order, 1-6, with #1 being the highest ranking and #6 being the lowest. In reading these results, an option that was ranked #1 by everyone would receive an average ranking of "1" and the option that was rated #6 by everyone would receive an average ranking of "6". Responses are shown in order, from highest to lowest rank.

Respondents identified as Staff, including both Elementary and Masconomet Staff.

#### Q13: How would you rank the options? (All Staff)

Unlike parents, Staff respondents were more unified in preferring Option A over all others. Of 273 responding staff members, 144 made it their #1 choice, and only 21 listed it as their #6 choice.



#### Q14: If cost was not a factor, how would you rank the options? (All Staff)

Some staff are also residents of the Tri-Town, and would bear the cost of the options. Staff may also be considering the cost to families in the districts. The order or options does change when cost is removed as a factor, but not as dramatically as it does for parents. Option A is still widely preferred.

#### Q13: How would you rank the options? (Masconomet Staff)

Masconomet staff are very different from parents: Option A is a clear choice, with Option B a distant second. Option F is the least liked.





#### Q14: If cost was not a factor, how would you rank the options? (Masconomet Staff)

#### Q13: How would you rank the options? (Elementary Staff)

Elementary staff are very different from parents: Option A is a clear choice, with Option B and D a distant second. Unlike Masconomet staff, Option E is the least liked for elementary Staff.



#### Q14: If cost was not a factor, how would you rank the options? (Elementary Staff)



## Q15 and Q16: Which options are acceptable and unacceptable?

We asked respondents to select the options they considered acceptable and to select the options they considered unacceptable. The results show the % of respondents who considered an option acceptable (positive percentages) or unacceptable (negative percentages). For example, a 100% would mean that everyone agrees that the option is acceptable and a -100% would mean that everyone agrees the option is unacceptable.

Respondents who identified as Staff, including both Elementary and Masconomet Staff. Responses are broken down into All Staff, Masconomet Staff, and Elementary Staff. The number of respondents is shown in parenthesis.

The Options most acceptable to All staff are: A (88%), B (45%), D (40%), and F (39%). The Options most acceptable to Masconomet staff are: A (91%), B (57%), and C (42%). The Options most acceptable to Elementary staff are: A (87%), D (53%), F (48%), and B (39%) Note that Staff find Option A (do nothing) much more acceptable than Parents do.

## Q17: What has informed your choices

Respondents used a Likert scale to answer this question (Strongly disagree, Disagree, Neither, Agree, Strongly Agree). Responses are shown on a -2 (strongly disagree) to +2 (strongly agree) scale.

Respondents identified as Staff, including both Elementary and Masconomet staff.

Staff do not believe that Masconomet students are alert and ready to learn at 7:35am, though they do agree that students would be alert and ready to learn at 8:30am. There is good agreement (1.51) that families need to enforce good bedtime routines for good health.
